Resource List: Elder Abuse

Created by the **Senior Protection Partnership**, below is information about what Elder Abuse is, as well as resources that can address abuse and neglect. These resources include services needed by those experiencing Elder Abuse, have concerns about Elder Abuse, and to help enhance the older adult and their caregiver's wellbeing.

What is Elder Abuse?

The World Health Organization (2020) defines Elder Abuse as:

"a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust which causes harm or distress to an older person"

Types of Elder Abuse:

Financial: Taking advantage (living rent-free), stealing money, misusing debit/credit cards when provided for a specific purpose.

Emotional: Yelling, crazy-making (amplifying or alleging memory loss), name-calling

Neglect: Not providing basic necessities (food, clothing, shelter, medical care)

Physical: Hitting, pushing, biting, grabbing in appropriately

Sexual: Includes inappropriate/unwelcome touch when providing assistance (e.g. bathing)

Medication: Over/under-medicating of older adults, taking medication for own use
