

## Speed Watch FAQs

1. What is the minimum age to be a Speed Watch volunteer?

The minimum age of our volunteers is 18 years.

2. What happens after I submit my name as a volunteer?

You will be asked to submit to an Enhanced Security Check (a process that can take up to two weeks to complete).

3. Will training be provided?

We'll provide training to you. The course takes three hours to complete. Your EPS contact will advise you as to when the next available training course will be offered.

You must successfully complete the training course in order to be a Speed Watch volunteer.

4. Do I need a driver's license?

Speed Watch volunteers works in teams of two; one volunteer on each team must have a valid Alberta driver's license in good standing.

5. Will I have to sign a waiver?

All volunteers must sign an authorization form (waiver) absolving the Edmonton Police Service and the City of Edmonton from liabilities, damages and actions as a result of the volunteer's participation in the program.

6. Are volunteers covered by Workers Compensation?

Yes, all volunteers are covered by Workers Compensation.

In addition to meeting all of the above criteria, you must practice and meet all current operational and dress code requirements.
