The Oskayak Police Academy was created to help educate Indigenous youth about policing practices, cultural and police protocols, and crime prevention initiatives.

The success of this program is in the collaborative efforts of all community members involved, who strive to create a safe and fun learning environment for our youth and police officers to interact and learn from one another.

The two-week program is geared towards self-identified Indigenous youth between the ages of 14 and 18 years, and offers numerous activities and opportunities to engage, inspire and inform.

Youth participants will:

- 🐾 Know something about the ways in which the Edmonton Police Service works within their communities.
- 🐾 Feel respected and safe within their communities and relationships with the police.
- 🐾 Do things in their communities that show leadership, strength, and positivity in the way forward to sustainable relationships with the Edmonton Police Service and have fun and positive interactions with police!
